

WHY DO WE SERVE?

Despite being an affluent County, many of our neighbors in Montgomery County are experiencing homelessness, living in poverty, are food insecure, or are in need of assistance. In 1983, Shepherd's Table was formed to respond to the need for meals for the hungry, and 36 years later, we are continuing to adapt our services for the growing and changing needs of our clientele. We believe that each person deserves respect, kindness and compassion while they are facing challenges in their life, and we are grateful for the opportunity to provide services to help folks on their journey from homelessness and hunger to housing and fulfillment.

When someone walks in our door, seeking a nutritious meal, assistance in the Resource Center, Eye Clinic, or Clothes Closet, our staff and 2,500+ dedicated volunteers respond with compassion and smile, providing assistance to the best of our abilities. For clients seeking services we don't provide, we make referrals to partner agencies that can better assist them.

Volunteers are at the heart of the mission of Shepherd's Table. Together we are meeting the needs of the community and changing lives.

HOW DO WE DO IT?

With the support of volunteers, individual donors, businesses, religious organizations, local government, and foundations, we are meeting the needs of our neighbors.

- The Food Services Program, our core program, provides a nutritious breakfast, lunch and dinner from Monday to Friday, and brunch and dinner on weekends and holidays.
- Our Resource Center provides a mailing address, information and referrals, prescription assistance, telephone access, transportation assistance, toiletries, and pro bono services provided by lawyers and barbers.
- Our **Eye Clinic** is Montgomery County's only free Clinic, providing eye exams and prescription glasses.
- Our weekly Clothes Closet provides clean, seasonally appropriate clothing, shoes, and accessories.
- Our staff and volunteers provide a safe space where individuals feel respected, cared for, and encouraged.

2019: YEAR IN REVIEW



After 15 years of dedicated service, Jacki Coyle stepped down as Executive Director of Shepherd's Table at the end of June. In her service, Jacki touched countless lives and dramatically increased our organization's impact through her vision and leadership in the past several years. The culture of Shepherd's Table - welcoming, friendly and compassionate - is a reflection of Jacki's wholehearted leadership and her impact both on the organization and the community. This feeling of kinship is experienced by anyone who walks in the door, whether they are a client, meal guest, volunteer, friend, or donor, and it is one that we are dedicated to sustaining. We thank Jacki for her leadership, as well as for her tremendous impact on Shepherd's Table and the Silver Spring community.

On July 8, Manuel "Manny" Hidalgo was appointed as the new Executive Director following a five-month, nationwide search process led by the Shepherd's Table Board. Hidalgo was born in Virginia to Cuban refugee parents, and is a long-time Silver Spring resident. He has been a leader and senior executive in national and Washington-area programs to support socially and economically disadvantaged communities. Hidalgo brings more than 20 years of senior management experience in the public and non-profit sectors, with a focus on the Latino community and issues of economic empowerment.

Our annual spring fundraiser, **Surfin' for the Table**, took place on April 6 at AFI Silver Theatre. The event honored and celebrated the contributions of Jacki Coyle as Shepherd's Table Executive Director after 15 years of service. The event raised \$170,500 in total to support our programs.

We also host groups coming in for a day of community service, or a team building activity, and we can often assign projects beyond our existing programs.











2019: FINANCIAL PICTURE INCOME
