
## **Housing & Homelessness in Montgomery County Fact Sheet**

Since 2022, housing has become **LESS** attainable. The state's Housing Wage has grown from \$28 to \$31 per hour, and Renter households paying more than 30% of their monthly income in rent the shortage has grown from 120,000 affordable homes to 140,000 (NLIHC 2023).

Maryland renters must earn

working full time to afford a Fair Market Rent 2 bedroom apartment, without being rentburdened (NLIHC 2023).


From January to August 2023, Montgomery County has evicted over 880 households. (MDDHCD 2023)

After years of a downward trend in homelessness, Montgomery County, MD has seen an **increase of 53%** since last year.

### Many factors affect homelessness; most notable is a housing problem.

For every 100 extremely low income Maryland households, there are only 29 vouchers or public housing units. Most people who need help cannot receive it.

Due to the affordable housing supply shortage, about 50% of MoCo renters are rent burdened.

Black, Hispanic/Latinx, and Indigenous renters are disproportionately more likely to be rentburdened (HAND 2023).
